Artists Tackle Handgun Violence in Kansas City with Unique Artwork

1. Presenting The Artists for Life Project

If someone called you on the telephone every 3.5 days and told you that someone had died from measles, you would be concerned. You would talking about this to everyone you knew and you would describe it as an epidemic. Yes, you might even be ready to move to another location. The murder rate in Kansas City has reached epidemic proportions! When most people think of murder rates, Chicago Illinois comes to mind. However, Kansas City's murder rate is 1.5 times greater than Chicago! Even more so, the murder rate in Kansas City is nearly 5 times the national average. In Kansas City a handgun murder is committed every 3.5 days.

2. What is The Artists for Life Project?

The Artists for Life Project is collaboration of artists that is directed by Kansas City artist Darryl A. Chamberlain. The artists are creating thought-provoking posters that speak to different audiences to address handgun violence in the Kansas City area. It is intended that the posters will cause people to contemplate the role that each can play in minimizing handgun violence in our city. These compelling and provocative posters will be placed in locations across the Kansas City area and will be directed to the various audiences of the community.

While most people think that Chicago Illinois has the highest murder rate in the country, the murder rate in Kansas City is 1.5 times greater than Chicago. What's even more shocking is that the murder rate in Kansas City is almost five times the national average. The artists of The Artists for Life Project want to change that.

The Artists for Life Project is a collaboration of artists who are creating compelling and provocative artwork to address the pressing epidemic of handgun violence in Kansas City. You are invited to attend the public reception of the artwork at The Artis Events Reception Hall at 3016 Cherry on March 28 from 5:00 to 9:00 PM. The doors will open at 5:00 PM with special presentations at 6:30 PM. Mayor Sly James and representative from KC No Violence Alliance will address the audience in regards to the pressing epidemic of gun violence in our city. Come and view the beautiful artwork and meet the artists who created it! The reception will also feature local poets and musicians throughout the evening. 6. The Artists for Life Project Constraints:

The Artists for Life Project is focused on minimizing or eliminating handgun violence in the Kansas City area. However, this project is not promoting the removal of ownership of handguns but rather, hopes to promote wise and prudent use of handguns. Our goal is to promote responsible gun ownership and prevention of tragedy.

7. The Artist for Life Project Directives:

The artists are creating compelling and provocative posters that address the various aspects of handgun violence which will be displayed in businesses, churches, and community centers around the Kansas City area. A specially-framed set of the art work will be displayed as a group in galleries around the Kansas City area where this artwork will change locations monthly. In the fall of 2014, a special art competition will be held in Kansas City high schools to encourage high school student artists to create artwork to address handgun violence. This artwork will be displayed in diverse locations around the city in the same manner as the professional artists.

We each have a responsibility and a voice in addressing the epidemic of murder in Kansas City. *The Artists for Life Project* is the voice of artists as they lend their talents towards solving this pressing epidemic. The artists of The Artists for Life Project hope to inspire others to find their own voice to address this pressing epidemic in Kansas City.
